- Great media coverage – locally and nationally



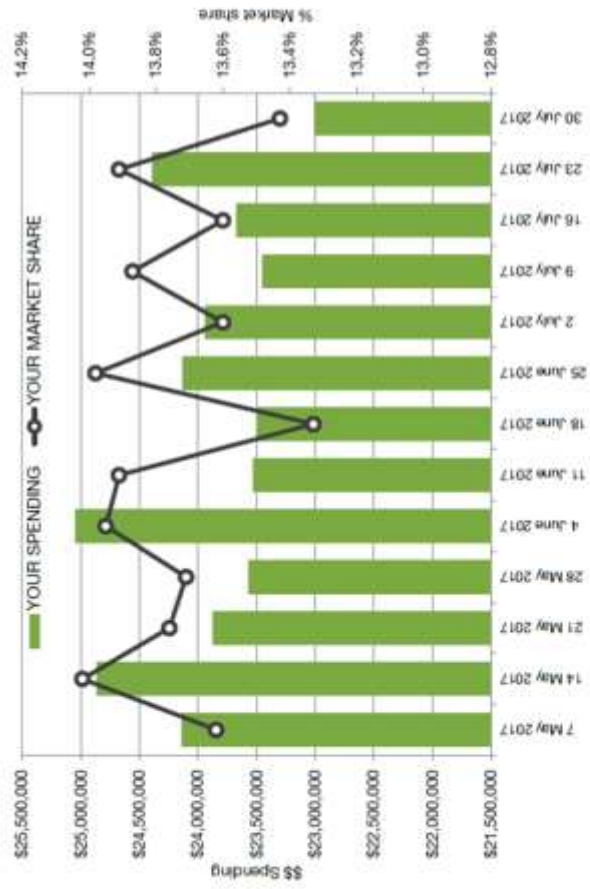
HOW HAS RETAIL ACTIVITY VARIED BY WEEK?

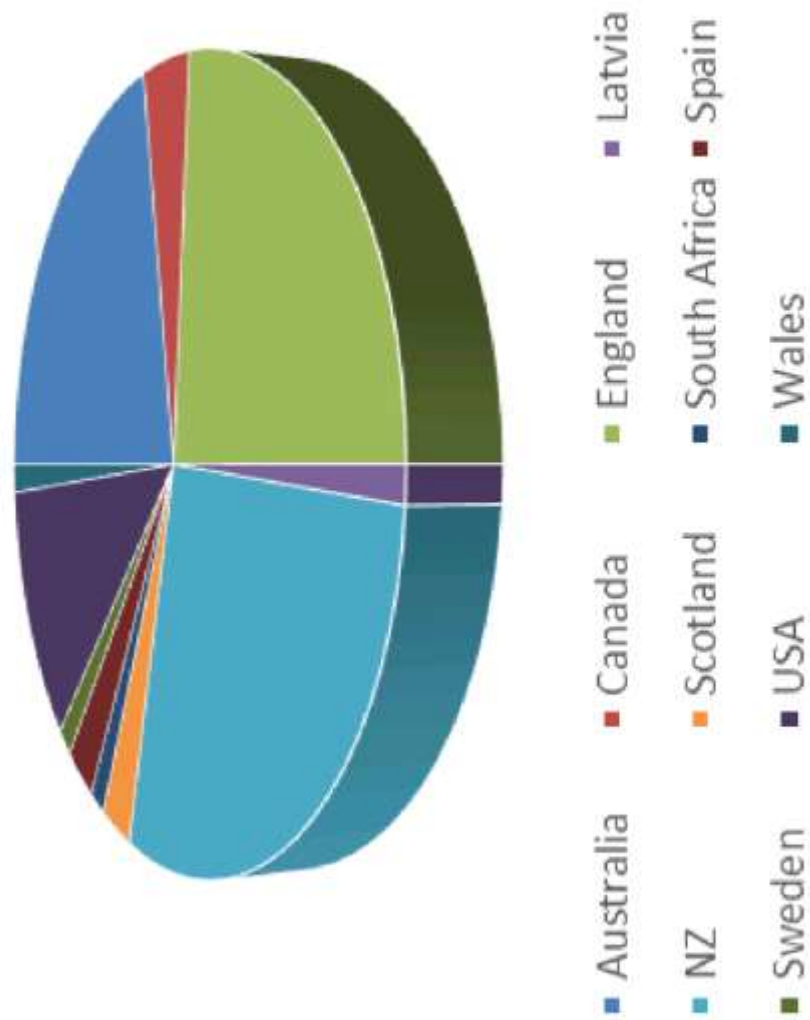

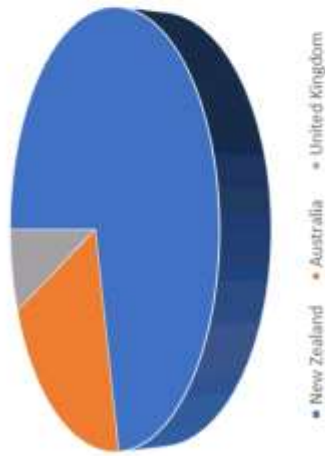

Maximum entries limited to 24, with four winners qualifying for WCF Worlds.

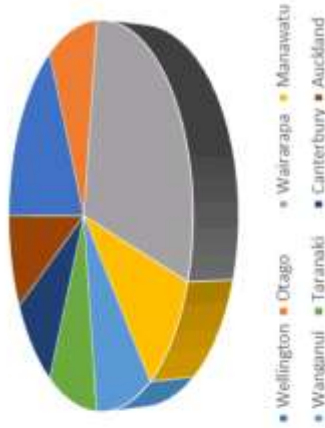
