MUSE is an exhibition of photographic work showcasing the diversity of using just one model. The series is an array of lighting techniques, costumes, make-up, digital techniques, locations and characters embodied by a single subject. Photographer Matt Barnes with model Sophia Slace shoot all around the lower North Island to produce works of mixed styles and laden with pop culture references



| Judy McIntyre | May 7th - 1st June



Creating imagery that relates to an imaginary world set in the context of the domestic, Judy McIntyre's sensitive works explore what drawing means for her as an artist - the comfort it brings through the immediacy of movement, the smudging, the layering, the gesture, the contour, the lines, the ground of the paper, playing with scale, and the messiness of the materials.

Te Whātu Raranga o Highbury Weavers will be working in our Square Edge Workshop Space once a term 10am - 2pm and are happy to work with you on your own projects. Call in and see their mahi, bring your own, or korero with them about starting a new project.

Ko matou he whātu raranga kakahu Hurburu.

We are weavers of Kakahu: Kahu Hurburu (Maori Feather Cloaks, Korowai (lashed cloaks), Rapaki, Hieke (rain capes) and other crafts; using traditional techniques with both traditional and contemporary materials. Using carpet wool, mop, jute or mukallax) as whenu (foundation) and cotton thread, jute or muka for the aho (rows), taniko thread/cottons to taniko. We use all types of feathers, donations welcome for our mahi atahua (beautiful work).

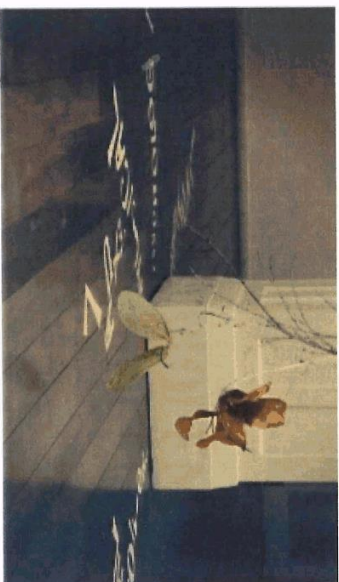
Our group was founded by the late Whaea Yvonne Marshall & Whaea Grace, whose mana left very strong values for us to follow

WAI - the Women's Art Initiative are a collective of women who make art in response to their experiences of violence and abuse. WAI are activists, advocates and artists.

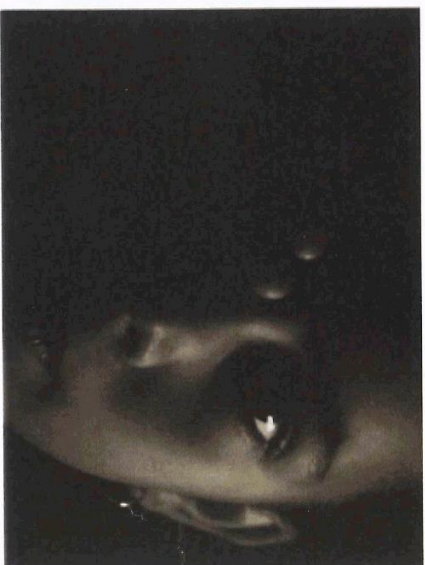

Black and White | 11 | June 2nd - 2nd July

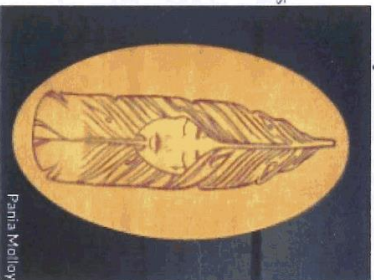
Formed in 2010 the Eleven photography group are this year celebrating their 10th exhibition together. Going back to basics with an interpretation from today, this year's theme is Black & White.

Te Kore | Keli, | February 4th -1st March



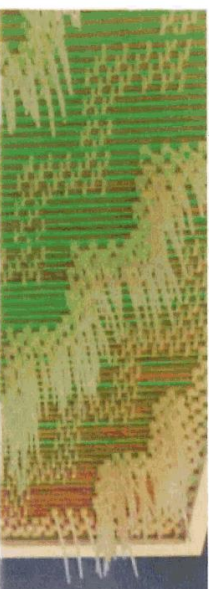

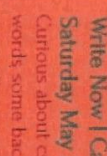

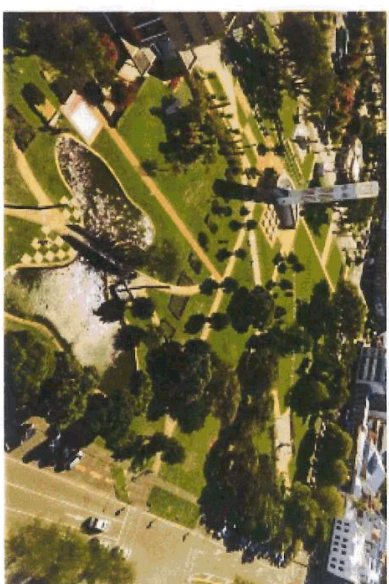
