

Our impact

- Golf: 100 participants and \$15,000 raised for Rural Support
- Spend \$20 in Palmy's CBD and go in the draw to win a winter weekend in Queenstown – 723 entries
- Free buses used by 3,443 v. 1494 in '23
- 41.5 bags of recycling vs. 23 bags of rubbish
- Charities supported: Companion Pets, Rehoming Standard Breds, Rehoming Working Dogs, Lions (the Glob), Greatmates, Palmy Hospital's Renal Unit, Palmy Rural Fire Service and Manawatu Rangitikei Rural Support.
